- Check the <u>DEQ Website</u> for current **Open** Burn restrictions
 - As conditions change, this map will be updated to reflect restrictions in our area



- Understand current Fire Danger Levels if a fire were to start in your area
 - Low The color green. Little danger of fire
 - Moderate The color blue. Fires not likely to become serious
 - High The color yellow. Fire may become serious
 - Extreme The color red. All fires are potentially serious
- Call your local fire agency and visit their website before you burn or use outdoor equipment to understand local restrictions or requirements
