Cullaby had a slight blue-green algae bloom. The wind pushes it around the lake. Parks staff checks in everyday with SM on the condition of the lake water. MH commented on wetland blue line streams that feed into West Lake. He's concerned about streams allegedly filled in by property owners and the use of herbicide possibly feeding blue green algae in local lakes.

46 47 48 49 50 51	Members started the discussion for recommendations for the Board of Commissioners work session, in the fall, concerning the Parks direction and Parks Master Plan update. Each member had time to share thoughts and ideas. Members will record their thoughts, send to EK for compilation and present at the next meeting. Discussion highlights included need for the Plan to be updated, use of consultants for various aspects of the parks, community engagement,

regional connection, and meeting the recreational needs of Clatsop County taxpayers and visitors.
